
















Explore the world of equestrian excellence at


What training programs and services does Chanone Stables offer, and how do you customise them for each horse and rider? Also, what aspect of training do you enjoy the most?

Why is the hindgut so important to the horse?

As herbivores, horses possess a unique digestive system known as hindgut fermentation, crucial for breaking down fibers and optimizing nutrient absorption. The hindgut operates at its peak efficiency when maintaining the correct pH balance.

However, if acidity levels become too high, the horse's ability to process nutrients diminishes, leading to potential negative impacts on their health and well-being. Understanding and maintaining the delicate pH balance in the horse's hindgut is paramount for ensuring their optimal digestive function and overall vitality.

Hindgut Dysfunction:

Hindgut imbalance can occur due to various factors like stress, sudden diet changes, high-grain diets, or medications, leading to hindgut acidosis. Hindgut acidosis results in an acidic gut environment, causing inflammation, gut wall damage, and toxin release into the bloodstream.

Impact on Health and Behaviour:

Hindgut acidosis can lead to severe health issues like laminitis, poor body condition, appetite loss, and compromised performance. Behavioral changes, including increased spookiness, aggression, stereotypical behaviors, and elevated stress levels, can also be linked to hindgut imbalance. Studies suggest hindgut health impacts immune response, healing rates, and may increase antibiotic requirements.

CONCLUSION

A healthy hindgut biome is vital for a horse's overall health, performance, and behavior. Understanding and managing hindgut health is essential for optimal horse care and management.

In essence, the hindgut plays a pivotal role in the horse's ability to digest forages efficiently, maintain good health, and exhibit balanced behavior, highlighting its critical importance in equine management and care.

Hindgut Dysfunction:

Common indicators of a higher likelihood of hindgut acidosis:

- · Poor weight
- · Bed eating/wood chewing
- Increased stereotypical behaviour
- · Poor appetite
- · Girthy behaviours
- · Metallically smelling faeces
- · Saddle/rugs slipping to the left
- Right hind mild lameness/right hind issues/unable to step through correctly
- Reluctance to canter/jump off right rein
- · Colic
- Laminitis
- Poor hair/hoof quality
- · Rug ripping
- · Slower than expected healing rates for injuries such as small cuts
- · Frequent infections/antibiotic usage
- Poor performance recovery

Signs that your horse could potentially have hindgut acidosis (note: there could be other physical reasons; always seek a vet's advice):

- Is your horse hot, making it difficult to put your leg on, and you feel more like a passenger than a rider?
- Does your horse cramp behind when jumping?
- · Is your horse resistant to having a hind leg picked up?
- Is your horse not muscling up as expected?
- · Does your horse exhibit general tightness throughout the body?
- · Does your horse have loose droppings?
- Does your horse suffer from tying up (Azoturia)?
- Is your horse a poor doer?
 - (Note: horses can still look well while having a low level of hindgut acidosis.)
- Is your horse generally grumpy, especially when grooming or tightening the girth?
- · Have you treated your horse for ulcers with the vet, only to have them return?

What are pre and pro biotics and how do they work?

Prebiotics: Non-digestible fibers that promote the growth and activity of beneficial bacteria in the gut.

Probiotics: Live microorganisms, often beneficial bacteria, that enhance the balance of the gut microbiota, supporting digestion and immune function.

THE IMPORTANCE OF HOOF BALANCE

"Hoof balance is a difficult term to define. Generally, it means similar length of hoof wall inside and outside (medial and lateral) and "normal length of toe and heel". In practice, however, it can be hard to determine what is normal and abnormal for a particular horse.

While hoof imbalances can be caused by poor trimming, they are also caused by abnormal skeletal conformation. For an adult horse that naturally grows an imbalanced hoof, there is no way to completely straighten the hoof by trimming. Deviations of the lower limb when viewed from the front cause the hoof to either grow toward the inside (pigeon toe) or outside (toe out). When viewed from the side, imbalances include club foot (excessive heel and steep hoof wall angle), and long toe/low heel.

Lameness can either result in, or be the cause of hoof imbalances. Lameness results from major deviations in the hoof because the angles place excessive strain on the hoof itself (bruising and laminar tearing), and strain on tendons, joints and ligaments in the limb. This can lead to overload and more serious injury or arthritis.

Chronic lameness can also cause hoof distortion. When a limb is either under-loaded or overloaded the hoof reflects that. If a hoof is overloaded on one side, the hoof grows less on that side. Sheared heels and hoof cracks can also result. "



PROPERLY BALANCED HOOVES

The image below illustrates the effect of incorrect trimming on the Hoof Pastern Axis (HPA), this being the alignment of the Long Pastern Bone, Short Pastern Bone and the Coffin or Pedal Bone, also known as the phalanges.

- On the left is ideal alignment, with equally distributed loading of the Suspensory Ligament and the 2 Flexor Tendons. It stands to reason that no single structure is overworked and injury is at low risk. Hoof landing is, ideally, slightly heel first and breakover occurs without overloading the Deep Flexor Tendon.
- The middle illustration happens when too much heel is taken to lower the hoof angle. The result is a "Broken Back" HPA. In this case, the Flexor Tendons (especially the Deep Flexor) are overloaded, putting excessive pressure on the Navicular Bone, especially during the breakover phase. Once the Navicular Bone starts to deteriorate, the damage is irreversible. This alignment also tends to cause toe first landing, resulting in a jarring effect on the joints between the phalanges. Low and high ringbone are the likely end result in the front limb. This imbalance often causes problems higher up in the hind limb, and even problems in the pelvic and spinal areas.
- The last illustration shows what is known as a "Broken Forward" HPA. Too much heel due to bad trimming, Conformation (Club/Boxy Feet) or unnecessary wedging. Here the Suspensory bears more load than it can realistically handle, since the raised hoof angle removes pressure, especially from the Deep Flexor Tendon. This predisposes the horse to Suspensory sprains or tears, which could very well be career ending. These horses also land hard, heel first, where the result is shunted up heels and very often contracted heels. Quarter cracks are also more likely to appear.

Is it silly to believe that our equine athletes will give us their best efforts if we do our best to keep them as comfortable as possible? Forcing them to accept incorrect and uncomfortable positions may pay short term dividends, but we will pay the price in the longer term.

DORSOPLANTAR IMBALANCES

Assessed by viewing the hind limb from the side.



On the left above is probably the most common imbalance I come across in the Saddlebred industry, induced as a result of the belief that lowering the angle will "force" the horse to use its hocks better, or "step in deeper underneath itself"! It may have this effect to a degree, but at what cost?

"While the implications for poor hoof balance in the front limbs are somewhat isolated for the main to the distal limb, in the hind pathology is referred to higher structures. Dyson et al. (2007) eluded to poor hind hoof balance being a predisposing factor in suspensory lesions, Mansmann et al. (2010) linked "long toe, low heel" conformation with gluteal pain, Pezzanite et al. (2019) concluded that horses with hind limb lameness localised to the distal tarsal and proximal metatarsal regions were likely to present with negative plantar angles and most recently Clements et al. (2019) correlated negative plantar angles with stifle pathology amongst others, with all of these studies highlighting the benefits of farriery intervention." (www.theequinedocumentalist.com)

Technical language which is summarized in laymen's terms as, "You're causing unimaginable damage to your horse by insisting the farrier lowers the hoof angle". Front End!

This is also often seen on the front feet (dorsopalmer imbalance), where the belief is that it will cause the horse to develop a longer stride, although the racehorse industry has proven that hoof angle has minimal effect on stride length.

MEDIOLATERAL IMBALANCES

Assessed by viewing the limb from behind or front.



Left above is an example of mediolateral imbalance, either genetical or man-made (over trimming the lateral/outside branch). On the right is the result of the correction, being balanced trimming and, if required, shoeing with a lateral extension.

This illustration supports the assertion earlier that imbalance in the hind hoof is likely to affect the higher anatomy of the hind limb. Front end!

Below are just 2 examples of cases of Sheared Heels I have come across over the years, where improper trimming has caused lasting damage to the hoof structure.






This remodelling of the hoof could be as a result of bad conformation, but is exacerbated by bad trimming in an effort to correct the conformational fault. With proper management and trimming, it should never get to this point. Once it gets to be as bad as these examples, it is very difficult, if not impossible to correct. Prevention is definitely better than cure!

Trimming for balance should be self-explanatory but can be tricky to achieve for the inexperienced farrier, and in some cases, even true for experienced farriers.

The trim is where the job of shoeing the horse starts, and is the most important element when addressing balance and soundness! This is why I chose this topic for this first article. I hope it gets the reader thinking and in the habit of casting a more critical eye over the standards applied to our horses.

The Interplay of Nature and Nurture:

CA Complex Interaction

Domestication can broadly be defined as the process by which wild organisms, whether plants or animals, undergo genetic, behavioural, and//or physiological changes as a result of selective breeding by humans. This process typically involves the intentional manipulation of traits desirable to humans over successive generations, leading to the adaptation of the organism to life in association with humans. Domestication often results in traits such as docility, increased productivity, and changes in morphology or behaviour that distinguish domesticated organisms from their wild ancestors.

The oldest domesticated plant species is believed to be emmer wheat (Triticum dicoccum), which was domesticated around 10,000 years ago in the Fertile Crescent region of the Middle East. Emmer wheat was one of the first cereal crops cultivated by early human societies, marking the beginning of agriculture and the transition from a hunter-gatherer lifestyle to settled farming communities.

As for the oldest domesticated animal species, it's widely accepted to be the dog (Canis lupus familiaris). Dogs were domesticated from wolves approximately 15,000 years ago, possibly even earlier, through a process of mutual adaptation and cohabitation with humans. Dogs played crucial roles in early human societies, serving as hunting companions, guards, and eventually evolving into the diverse array of breeds we see today.

The domestication of horses is a pivotal moment in human history, profoundly impacting civilization's development and shaping human evolution in various ways. The domestication of horses likely occurred around 4000-3500 BCE on the Eurasian steppes, particularly in regions such as the Ukrainian steppes and the Central Asian grasslands. Initially, wild horses, such as the now-extinct Tarpan, were selectively bred for traits that made them more suitable for human use, such as docility and strength.

Domesticated horses revolutionized transportation, enabling faster and more efficient travel over long distances. This innovation facilitated trade, communication, and the spread of ideas, contributing to the interconnectedness of human societies. The emergence of horse-drawn chariots in ancient civilizations like Mesopotamia and Egypt further accelerated societal advancement. Horses further revolutionized agriculture by replacing slower and less efficient methods of plowing and transportation. The introduction of horse-drawn plows and carts increased agricultural productivity, enabling farmers to cultivate larger areas of land and produce surplus food. This surplus supported population growth and the emergence of complex societies.

By integrating genetic knowledge with effective management practices, breeders can harness the full potential of nature and nurture to achieve their breeding goals.




Fever was purchased on 02.04.2009 and under the capable guidance of the Westhuizen Family from Straussburg took to the showgrounds with flying colors.

journey started together in 2014 just after Cobra had won the 2014 SA 5-Gaited Grand Championship, unfortunately Cobra's previous owner Marius Day passed away just a little after that and Cobra became available for purchase. Never in a million years would I have even considered riding left alone owning King Cobra. At that time I was riding at Buckridge stables with Elizka Jordaan. Dirk Claasens was stabling some horses with her at the time. They put me on him to see if we would be a match, and WOW! When I got in the saddle and walked a few paces it literally felt as if I have ridden this horse my entire life, it felt as if we were made for one another. It was like I just knew him, I instantly trusted Cobra and we have been like that ever since that very day!

He was and still till today at the age of 19 years has the biggest heart and is always ever willing! Never have I ever had a dull ride with him. Dirk was at that time still assisting Elizka with working Cobra and guiding us, we went on to compete at our very first show at The Parys Christmas Festival in 2014 and what a show that was! He was so much Horse to experience, I have never ridden a horse that has the ability to give me so much goose bumps as he has. He was very eager and very willing during that show and if you know me, you know how much I love speed, so we were a match made to keep up with! We were crowned the Parys Reserve Amateur 5-Gaited Champs. We went on to become the 2015 SA Grand Champion Amateur winners at Bloem show, as well as the 2015 Parys Christmas Festival Amateur Champs.

Unfortunately, our journey at Buckridge came to an end in 2017, where we tried but struggled to find the harmony between, myself, Elizka and Cobra, the combination was just not working too great for us and I had decided that I had to take a risk and move Cobra to another trainer for better suit. With me being based in Bloemfontein and not wanting to move him too far away our options were limited and I was not sure what to do, (There was a lot of trainers very eagerly willing to take Cobra in), we took him home that December to go and take a bit of a break. In that time Martin sent me a message out of the blue saying that he would really like the opportunity to work with me and Cobra and see if we will be a good fit! It was like a prayer had been answered and we took the leap of faith! Never regretted one second of it!

Cobra was quite a difficult horse on the ground, he was not always very trusting and he is so big and intimidating and believe me, he knows it, however he was never mean. So on our way home I was driving with Martin, preparing him on all the issues he might encounter with Cobra. We stopped there and Martin just walked over to him, Cobra came towards him and behold! Love at first sight! Cobra has never been so trusting with anyone! I knew then no matter what happens, our paths were destined to cross and this was the right fit!

Myself, Martin and Cobra's journey from that day has been so dear and special to me. The way the three of us just connected and clicked is very rare. We talk about this often, how Cobra has never given us one day's worth of grief or any trouble, just always stepping up (Don't be fooled, he does still try and push his luck to see where the boundaries are sometimes for his own giggle more than anything).


